16 Sunday:

Another glorious morning: little to do. Rec letter from Miss J. Jones Cardiff. Write article by A. G. G. on Ireland - a scathing attack on England's policy.

Write to Mrs Lloyd & Jennie Jones.

Attend Communion service at 9 p.m. few present. Sermon again disappointing: Text - Deceitful.

19 Very hot day: 90 in the shade. Corporals play Sergeant at cricket - Rent - 4/6 100 for 5 wicket (not out) to 29. White-Dennis & concert in the evening; Had a very enjoyable time. This sort of thing tends to bring men nearer to each other.

Received parcel from Shweymon with few books & cigarette.

20 Another hot day. Nothing much doing.

Italian offensive goes on: holding their own it seems. Take a short-stroll over to the cornfield: read Growney Cues: What a treat: it was to read good Welsh.

21 Received 3 letters & papers 10/- from Mat one from V.P. & one from Pugh. Mat not well. Pugh's letter interesting: gives his view on current events: He is likely to go to India. Afternoon off. Sleep all the afternoon.

Last night was full of adventures:

Just as we had put ourselves down to sleep most of us were well away in dream land, the first alarm was given some had to jump out of bed to put out an imaginary fire. When all was over we got back to our beds but we had

not been down 2 hours when a huge
explosion heard. We got out again
& saw the chgs all lit up. Others way
a report after reports were heard evidently
a double "gone up". It appears it was
as French ammunition dump.

This morning another huge report
was heard & a big cloud of smoke
seen over the town - evidently another
dumkgone went.

climb in doors. Bowen admitted

26 Fine day. Brown narrow & whistle admitted. Shad handed: plenty of work to keep going. Take a walk through the cornfields: Greek way cutting corn: how primitive this method: few here & those with sick: asses carry sheaves (6) away: glorious night.

27 Air raid last night: didn't hear it myself so soundly I slept.

Fine morning: several for orderly room including N.C.O. came for selling sugar to Greek. - Reminded.

Hess of a great strategic victory & consequent riots at Vienna. Would that someone of the belligerents would give up!

Sgt Hook admitted with others.

Lovely evening. Air raid at 2 a.m.

28 Lovely morning. Receive 5 letters 1 from Mels / from Rachel / from V.G. / from Joyce / from Dai

Mahul doing well in his exams. Jack Bryce expecting to be called up. All well in Lanka John still free. Dai getting on well.

Rec. "table group" from Mah. Beautiful sunset made the dark clouds reddish gold - parable.

29 Rec letter from March who: still at S.H. acc to his transfer to Inf are cancelled protest: I wish it were for good! Fairly busy today: Rec. letter from Miss Jaws. Thunderstorm

30 Sunday Morning:

On duty all day: Thunderstorm & some rain. A man from 49 G. HP. Evan Treherbert calls to see if Welsh Service is still held. His enthusiasm for Service touches me. Fancy ~~writing~~ writing 8/1000 to find out a service - and that in the Army. Truly God has still his faithful prophets in the Land.

Rec letter from Rachel. all well & job
still free. Thunder storm & heavy rains.

Attend service including Communion service.
Only 4 of us present in the tent.
