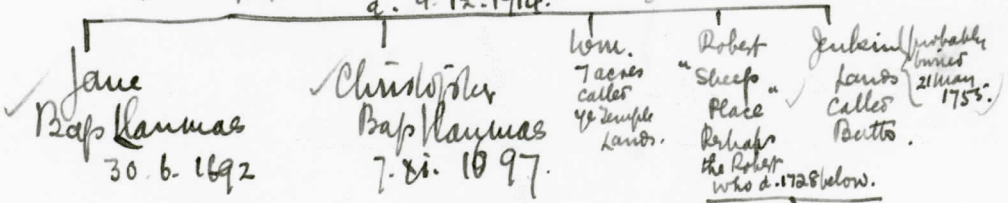

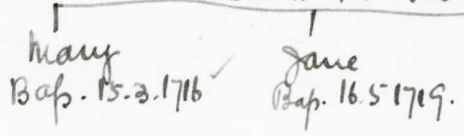

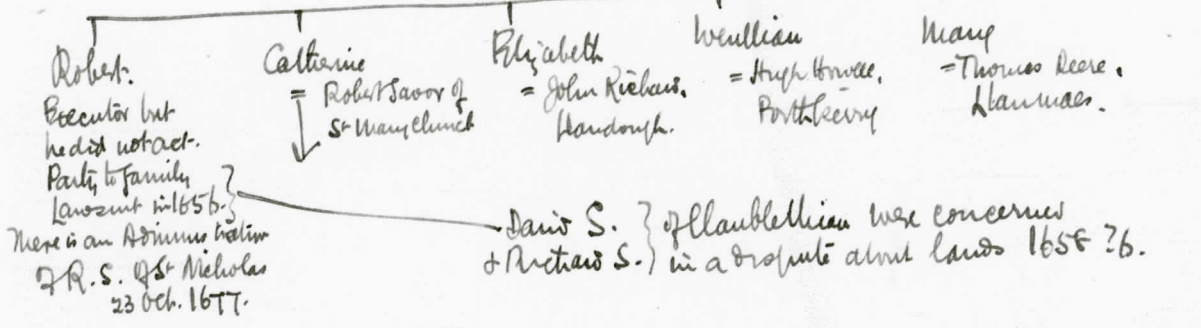

"Lately bought" in the will of 1749 points out that Nathaniel  
put up the sundial & surely it was Sweeting's. W.A.F.

I can't find my references to subsequent ownerships by John Dees a very acquisitive  
Cowhite lawyer (who eventually married the widow of Rev. of Court Colman — Rev. Broad Lea his  
Christ. widow was young, estate was £100,000 or so) & the late Ballaw people. W.A.F.
