LLANBLETHIAN TOWER.

In spite of trying and uncertain weather the work of renovating the tower is progressing rapidly, and we hope that the whole work of restoration, including the rehanging of the peal of bells, will be finally completed by the 24th July, which is the possible date fixed by the Bishop for the dedication.

The date of the primary visitation of the Bishop has been changed from the 12th to the 10th July in consequence of the King's visit to Cardiff on the 12th. Matins will be sung that morning at 11.30.

The Vicar is obliged to delay the issue of the third annual report because the list of promised subscriptions to the Tower Fund is not complete. As soon as the subscriptions have all come in then the list will be immediately sent to the printers.


