# Introduction to the Swansea Town census

## 30 March 1851

What can we learn about the place and the people from the census?



**THE CENSUS**—The enumerators will leave the forms in the course of next week, and will call for them on the Monday following, the 31st March. There is a penalty of 5l., for refusing to fill up the forms correctly. The following are the particulars which will be required of the head of every family:—Name and surname—no person absent on the night of March 30th to be entered—write after the name of the head of the family, the names of his wife, children, and others of the same surname; then visitors, servants, and &c. Relation to head of family—state whether wife, son, daughter, or other relative, visitor, or servant. Condition—write “married,” “widower,” “widow,” or “unmarried,” against the names of all persons, except young children. Sex—write “M” against males, and “F” against females. Age [last birthday]—for infants under one year, state the age in months, writing “under 1 month,” “1 month,” “2 months,” &c. Rank, profession, or occupation. Where born—opposite the names of those born in England, write the county, and town or parish; if born in Scotland, Ireland, the British colonies, the East Indies, or in foreign parts, state the country; in the last case, if a British subject, add “British subject.” If deaf and dumb, or blind—write “deaf and dumb,” or “blind,” opposite the name of the person.—It would greatly facilitate the business of the enumerators, if persons would have their schedules properly filled by the time they called for them.

On 21 March 1851 *The Cambrian* newspaper informed the residents of Swansea about the census. What happened if you didn't fill out the form correctly?

Schedule Number - not the same as the house number

Name & surname of person staying at this address on the night of 30 March 1851

Street Name & house number often not recorded

This record: the total number of houses on this page:  
I - inhabited  
U - uninhabited

This column shows the relationship between the people in the house. There is always someone called the Head of the Family, usually the father or husband

Age on census night - separate columns for males & females

Occupation Usually not given for married women

Folio Number

The last column was to record whether someone had a disability - if they were blind or deaf & dumb

UK county & town or village where someone was born. If born outside UK then often only a country is given. Remember that countries in 1851 were often known by different names eg, Prussia is now part of Germany.

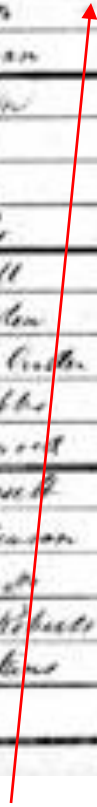

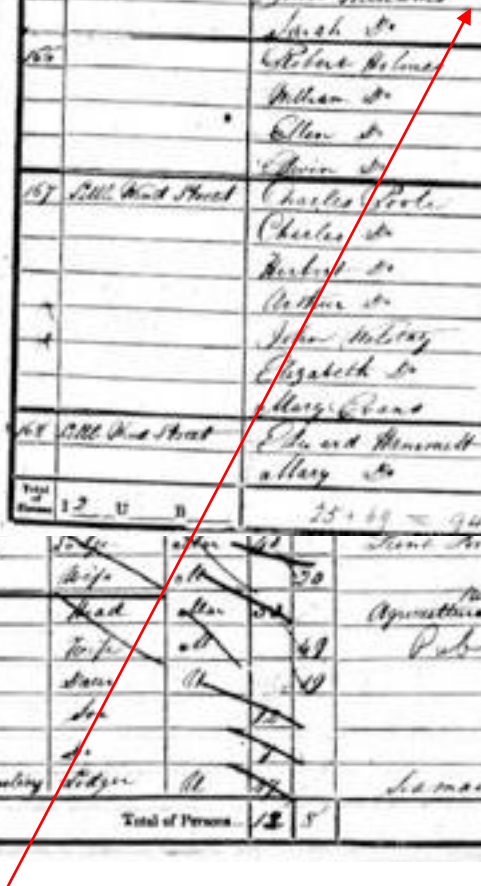

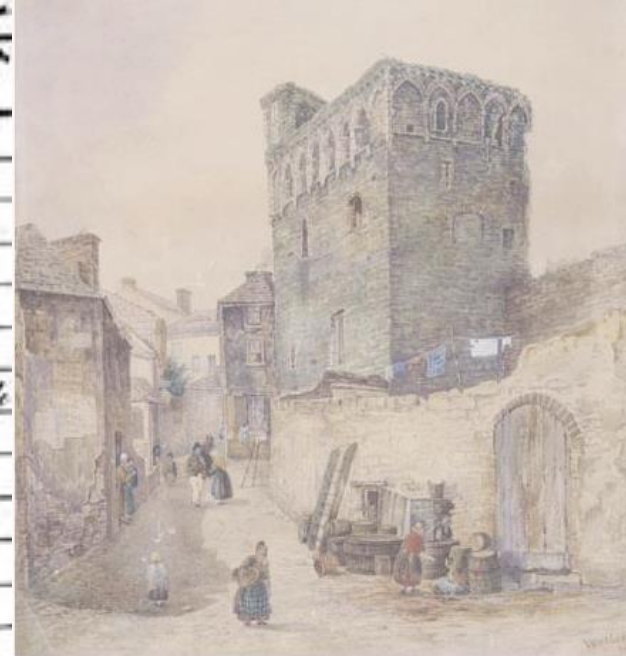
