Water balers are only used in Towy coracles. They are used in a scooping action. Water enters Towy coracles more because they fish in very open stretches of the estuary.

The baler was made from the heartwood of a sycamore tree and took may hours of patient work.

Having completed the bowl, he unfortunately dropped it and it split in two, not wishing to discard his work of art he set about sewing it together with copper wire.
