NUCLEAR WEAPONS TRIALS

The current situation:

France: President Mitterand has extended France's nuclear testing moratorium, and has publically declared his support for a Comprehensive Test Ban Treaty (CTBT). France's policy now is not to be the first country to restart nuclear weapons tests.

Former Soviet Union: the four nuclear weapons states are all in favour of a CTBT, and have also said they will not be the first to restart nuclear weapons tests.

USA: President Clinton has stated that he is both in favour of a CTBT and of restarting American nuclear tests (!). The US moratorium is due to end on July 1. During the last weeks of the Bush administration, the Russians were told that work will start on June 7 at the Nevada test site for a nuclear explosion on July 28. The date has neither been confirmed nor denied by the Clinton administration.

Britain: still officially opposed to the US moratorium, but unable to conduct any nuclear tests because of it. The government opposes current moves towards a CTBT.

China: last tested in September 1992. Although not prepared to declare a moratorium on their own nuclear testing programme, they have said that they would sign a CTBT.

Clearly American actions will dictate events concerning nuclear testing; whilst our government is being obstructive, Britain is powerless to conduct any nuclear weapons tests without American permission to use the Nevada test site.

the Foreign Office, Lady Chalker said in the Lords 'We continue to see the need for some nuclear weapons testing as the best means of maintaining the safety and credibility of our deterrent'. Please write to her c/o Foreign and Commonwealth Office, Whitehall, London, pointing out that we will be safer with a CTBT, which would hinder other countries trying to develop nuclear weapons.

We know Monday is a difficult day, but this is the day work is due to start at the Nevada test site and elsewhere in the USA, at Aldermaston and elsewhere in Europe. bout 25 Ramblers for Peace walked the 'permitted' path across the Cnewr Estate on the Brecon Beacons. The path travels between the A4067, south of the Crai reservoir and the Glyntawe road, taking in some spectacular views down to the coast and an armsweeping panorama of the Beacons. The rain came down and we went for tea at the Mountain Centre having erected smart bilingual signs saying 'Keep MoD Out' and 'No Military', and communal letters were signed and sent to Jonathan Evans – MP for Brecon and Radnor – and to the Chairman of the National Park. We consider that the MoD already has too much access to the Welsh countryside. The morality of this is very dubious at a time when it is becoming more obvious that real security can only be properly ensured by international understanding, co-operation and diplomacy.

Trawsfynydd

he ageing MAGNOX nuclear power station at Trawsfynydd in Gwynedd has not produced electricity for 26 months. The tie rods supporting the reactor vessel have corroded; it's been reported that the metal used for these rods was incorrect.

Nuclear electric is proposing to restart the reactor at a higher temperature and lower pressure to influence the ductability of the metal. This would be a dangerous operation, particularly during startup and the close-down.

The Nuclear Inspectorate has not accepted Nuclear Electric's proposals to restart, and have set further conditions before a start-up is sanctioned.

We must oppose this highly dangerous plan to restart Trawsfynydd. A melt-down could occur with catastrophic consequences for Gwynedd, Wales and much of Britain.

We must continue to press the Nuclear Inspectorate to refuse to allow Nuclear Electric to restart the reactors at Trawsfynydd. Write to The Nuclear Installations Inspectorate, 1 Chepstow Place, Westbourne Grove, London, W2 4TF.

Trawsfinished March 13 1993. About 150 demonstrators spent a day at Trawsfynydd under a blue sky on March 13. Some chained themselves to the gate. The station engineer John Ellis came out to talk to the concerned protesters. A child from Merseyside CND held a banner saying 'If the Romans had nuclear power, we'd still be guarding their waste'.
