From these stories she started finding out about her own roots, and now she will find yours for you ... subject to what documents and sources survive to help her build up your family tree.

Finding family is not the only service she offers through her business, Coden Beth. Beth also does one name and one place studies. One name studies involve researching everything about one surname, whereas a one place study is focussed on a specific location (e.g. street or a building) where Beth will find out everything about it from the rich documentary history available through census and other civil and religious records.
