PLATINUM JUBILEE CELEBRATIONS

Thursday June 2nd – the World celebrates

From noon, visit the Church to see floral contributions from St Hilary villagers. This display will last until Sunday pm.



While you are there, collect your trail guide for the official "Corgi Trail" from the church porch. Find the clues around the village that lead to the lovable

Jubilee Corgis. Return your answer sheet to the box in the porch.

From 5pm there will be live music at the Bush Inn with Seb and his all-star bands, and special guests. Liz, Andy and all the staff are looking forward to welcoming you. The bar will be open, the pizza oven fired up and a full range of food will be available.



At approximately 6.30pm there will be a traditional Tug of War on the village green adjudicated by Andy from the Bush Inn. Sign up in the pub from 5pm. From 9pm join the torch light procession up St Hilary Down to the Clump, following the marked trail to the location for the Platinum Jubilee Beacon. Join in the singing while we wait for the beacon to be lit.



At 9.45pm the beacon will be lit – see how many other beacons are visible across the Vale, Valleys and in Somerset!

Sunday June 5th – the Village celebrates



From 10am visit the exhibition of memorabilia from the Coronation year and previous Jubilees in the village hall.

At 11.30am there will be a crafting session in the village hall. This is an opportunity for the young ones to make crowns and other items

At 3pm the prize giving for the Fancy Dress and the Races will take place ahead of Afternoon Tea being served in the marquee.



At 4pm everyone will have the opportunity to taste and vote on the Platinum Puddings in the village hall with the Prince or Princess of Puddings

being announced at 4.30pm to end the weekend's festivities.
