

69 High Street

Owned and occupied in 1844-51 by Ann Llewellyn, an annuitant, maltster and grocer aged 78 in 1851, born in Cowbridge. She was succeeded in 1861 by Eliza Llewellyn, aged 47, a landed proprietor, born in Cowbridge, and in 1871 by a doctor, John Llewellyn, also born in Cowbridge and presumably a relative. This was probably also true of William Llewellyn, who was there in 1881, the Vicar of Penllyne, aged 75.

71 High Street

Owned and occupied in 1844-51 by Elizabeth Sim(p)kins, a fundholder aged 70 in 1851, born in Cowbridge. In 1861 she had been succeeded by Mary S. Llewellyn, her sister, aged 62, described as a landed proprietor. The house seems to have been unoccupied in 1871 and in 1881 to have been the home of John H. Davies, aged 70, described as a retired farmer and as an imbecile.
