

Penylan, Newton

- 1859 Edward Mordecai – lands and tenements, partly near the Finger Post and partly at Penylan Newton, all in own occupation. *Register of electors*
- 1878 Abraham Collier, Joseph Collier (rateable value both over £12 *Reg of electors*
- 1889 William Triggy, dwelling house *County register*
- 1939 Burial of Edith Olwen Tyler, aged 35 *Welsh St Donats records*
- 1946 Burial of Frederick Codd, aged 60 *Welsh St Donats records*

From the reminiscences of E W Miles 1860 – 1930 :

..... going to Penylan Newton as a boy, and visiting a small cottage occupied by an old woman whose name I with-hold. The front and only door opened into her room on the ground floor, where there was a bedstead with a bed and a heap of wraps thereon. Fowls were walking about the room, and a pig seemed to be treated as one of the family. The floor under the bed was stored with swedes or field turnips, which gave a very pungent aroma to the room, but this was an exceptional case and did not typify the cottagers as a class, for they were generally clean and neat.
