Mrs Llewellyn was Sarah Thomas (cl755 -183 7) who married (1) Chas Simkins (d 1793) and (2) Llewellin Llewellyn (d 1800). Her daughters were Elizabeth Simkins (1780-1855) and Mary Shaftesbury Llewellyn (1799-1866).

71 High Street - Prospect House

Long known as 'Mary Shelcott's house' in the 18th century (though who Mary Shelcott, or Gilcot, was we do not know), this was part of the Pierce Cornish estate and was sold on the bankruptcy of John Wilson, Cornish's heir. Mary Gilcot continued as tenant for some years, but by 1784 the owner was Nathaniel Williams and the occupier Anthony Thomas.

Then came a variety of owners and occupiers. Mrs Francis Taynton owned the house in 1800, when it was occupied by the Revd JJ Jones. Taxed at 4/-, it was considered a fairly sizeable property. By 1815, Thomas Llewellyn owned and occupied the property, but its condition deteriorated so that by 1830 it was taxed as a stable

It remained in the hands of the Llewellyn family for some time, as the 1843 occupant, Elizabeth Simpkins was a Llewellyn by birth. Elizabeth lived there (as a fundholder, aged 70) in 1851 with her sister, Mary Llewellyn, and after Elizabeth's death Mary (a funded and landed proprietor) continued to live there in 1861. Their relative prosperity suggests that the house was rebuilt some time between 1830 and 1843.

The 1871 census saw it unoccupied, but in 1881 the head of the family there was John Davies a retired farmer who had been born in Cowbridge, with his two daughters, both school governesses, two boarders and a servant. Sydney Gibson, an auctioneer and surveyor, originally from Birmingham succeeded the Davieses, and eventually SD Evans the tailor came to retire here by 1912.

In its transition to commercial premises it was 'Louise - the Gown Shop' between 1967 and 1972. It is now occupied by David Birt, estate agents.
