hereby make and give my last will and Testament

in manner and form following, I, *John Bassa* do hereby make
and give unto all other and former will or wills
by me at any time heretofore made, and do hereby
give and bequeath unto the hand of Almighty God my
Soul, and my Body, to His Grace, from whom I
trust to be directly saved at *St. Mary's* in this County
of *Cambridge* and bequeath to the poor of the County
of *Cambridge* a good sum of money, to wit, *Twenty*
Pounds to the poor of the City of *London* in this County
of *Cambridge* twenty Shillings, *Twenty* Pounds to the poor of the
City of *St. Paul's* a good sum of money, to wit, *Twenty*
Pounds to the poor of the City of *London* in this County
of *Cambridge* twenty Shillings, which said several sums to be
paid and distributed to and amongst the most needy
and distressed of the said poor, with the said several
sums, I, *John Bassa* do hereby give and bequeath
unto my dear Grandson *John Bassa* and all the
issue male whatsoever my lands in *London* and elsewhere
more or less with all the garden, orchard, out-lets, and
appurtenances thereto belonging, as largely and amply as
I purchased the same of *William Willoughby* of *Cambridge*
Esquire and *John Doorman*, and of the same are firm and
strong.

by me within the said Towns, I have and do hold
 the said Message and to myself with every their appointed
 into the said John Cains his heirs and assigns for ever
 I am I am to the said John Cains and assigns for ever
 and also my good signeth, Sir John Cains, Sir John Cyp
 and Sir John Mnt Cyp, who are on the Balle of Bempse

 bedding, linen, and household stuff what so ever, bridge
 and standings in my house where in I now dwell, I am I
 give to my Grandson, Richard Cains, Son of John Cains

 give to my Grandchild, John Cains, the sum of Ten
 pounds, all which said sums, and of several other sums
 given to my six Grandchildren, shall to be paid, delivered
 or employed to the best advantage of every of them especially
 within the space of five years, next after my decease, but
 shall in case any or either of them, the said John, Richard,
 Mary, Ann, John, or John Cains, shall die before the said five years
 shall be expired, or before they shall be arrived in age to the said five years,
 or before they shall be married, or before they shall be otherwise disposed of, then my will is that the same or portion of them shall

....to my dear grandson John Carne that messuage where my son in law Edward Carne gent now lives (with garden, orchard etc) which I purchased of Wm Williams of Cowbridge alderman; other bequests to grandson Richard Carne, grand-daughters Mary, Ann and Cissill Carne, grandchild Jennett Carne. To daughter Mary, wife of Edward Carne, that messuage and 2 acres arable and pasture which I lately purchased of Morgan Bassett of the said town (in the parish of Llanblethian nr a place called Beggars Bush) and also that messuage where Jenkin Llewelin and Wm Llewelin now dwell together with the little croft and all gardens, orchards etc, with the 6 acres arable & pasture in 2 parcels in Llanblethian adjoining the Glebe, called the Downs, as lately purchased of Katherine Jones of Llanblethian widow. Also 3 acres and a half in the Vingland, several acres abutting Heol y Lane Head as purchased of George Kemeys of Llanblethian and wife Margaret. After Mary's death, to said John Carne.
