of all recommending my soule into the hands of almighty God who  
gave it me and my Body to be decently Buried at the discretion of my  
Exors hereinafter named. And as to such Temporall Estate I bequeath  
God so bestow on mee I give devise & bequeath the same in manner  
expressed following (That is to say) I give devise & bequeath  
my freehold house in Cambridge where we now live together w<sup>th</sup> all appurtenances thereto  
belonging I give devise and bequeath the same to my well  
coloured wife together w<sup>th</sup> all the household stuff therein at the  
same and now in possession to hold to her and her assigns during  
her widowhood, After her decease and after the determination of that  
Estate I give and devise the said freehold appurtenances w<sup>th</sup> the appurtenances  
unto my well coloured sister Brother Edward David to have and  
hold to her John David and his assigns during the Termes of  
his natural life And after his decease I give & devise the  
said house w<sup>th</sup> all and singular appurtenances unto my well coloured  
Brother Edward David to hold to him the said Edward David his heirs  
and assigns forever And as for touching and concerning the  
household stuff above bequeathed to my said wife  
in case she happens to marry I give & bequeath the same  
unto my said Brother Edward immediately after such her Marriage  
(Except the best Woodward best feather Bed, Bolster, Ruggs  
of 12 Linnen the best pair of Sheets, Table Cloth  
Linnen, Best quilt Six of the best pewter plates and three  
pewter plates and seven of the best Chaires, w<sup>ch</sup> I hereby give  
and bequeath unto my said well coloured wife Margaret then  
Att my will & bequeath That such of my Leghees above named as  
shall be in the immediate possession of my freehold house above  
mentioned shall provide and maintain my well coloured mother  
Margaret David during her life, I give & bequeath my  
best Black wash Coat & Breeches and best Linnen Drapery  
to my Brother John David, And as to the rest of my  
wearing Apparel woollen Linnen and the said I give  
and bequeath unto my well coloured Brother Edward David.

And finally as to all the rest of my goods Chattels and Credits  
of what kind or nature so ever and Give and Bequeath the same  
unto my said wife Colowd wife Margaret whom I have by  
nominate and appoint whole and sole Exec<sup>or</sup> & as also  
sole and only Legatee of this my last will here by Revoking  
all former Wills by me made & declaring this to be my last  
Will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set  
my hand and Seal this 20<sup>th</sup> day of October Anno D<sup>ni</sup> 1730.
