Lincolne right shire of give toward the church

be buried in wedded wife of myselfe and Maister  
and I do now inhabit in a dwelling together with all  
gardens and other lands belonging to me  
and to my wife of myselfe and Maister  
and regular Capitanes unto my said Maister  
my dowrye for him during his widowes estate  
of give his body to my wife and all of  
shewen outside our quarters of our house, shalke and  
being at Lincolne shire aforesaid, as he shalke be  
unto my said Maister of ground, as he shalke be  
my said Maister my wife, from him after my de-  
cease for him during his widowes estate, as  
aforesaid, of give his body and body to my said wife,  
and shalke be two free Cottages, and shalke be  
Lincolne shire aforesaid, as he shalke be unto my  
said Maister and his wife of my said Maister  
my wife, from him after my decease, for him du-  
ring his widowes estate, as aforesaid, of give to  
my said wife, our free Cottages, shalke be at Lin-  
colne shire aforesaid.

at a place there called the Five points, Joseph had  
to go to the house of the cottage with the Carpenter to get  
the door repaired my house. From the land after my de-  
-parture for land during the widowhood of the late  
-John of the good land bequeathed to Anne Mary my daughter  
and will of the late John bequeathed to the said Mary my daughter  
to the said John and to the said John of the good land to my daughter  
-Mary Mary, two my land & you, land and like  
-of the said John of the good land bequeathed to the said  
-Catherine my wife. All the said land bequeathed of  
-my goods, chattels, and debts, not before bequeathed
