Constance to be my sole and full Executor of

I give the house and garden wherein I now live, after the death of my beloved wife Jonet, between my supposed[?] daughter Margaret[?] William and my nephew Watkin Howell, to be equally divided.

I give my supposed[?] daughter Margaret William £5 within ten years after my death.

I give to Watkin Howell my nephew, £5 to be paid by my executor, ten years after my decease.

I appoint my wellbeloved wife Jonett to be sole executrix of this my last will and testament.
