 thirtie pound to be paid when she doe accomplish the full
 age of one & twenty yeare by my daughter Jane Lewis
 named, I give and devise unto my daughter Jane Lewis
 my now dwelling house Courtledge & what garden or
 other of land on Barne formerly called I wayne house
 Courtledge and ^{part} of land commonly called by the name
 of my son withy by, by the name of the house
 my first daughter & to her heire for ever, with all the right
 appurtenances thereto belonging, all the right
 of Calaban & County aforesaid, I do give & bequeath to my
 daughter Jane all my good Cattle & Chattels whatso ever movable
 & immovable, not before bequeathed whom I doe make ordaine
 & declare to be my sole executrix of this my last will & testament
 In witness whereof I have hereunto sett my hand & seal
 the xxv day of November Anno dⁿⁱ 1666
