2. Will of Jenkin Willett

In the name of God amen, I Jenkin Willett of the parish of Lanblethian, being sick in body make my last will and testament 3 March 1670, revoking all former wills. I bequeath my soul to the hands of the almighty maker of heaven and earth and my body to be buried at the church of Lanblethian in christian burial.

I give my grandchild Edward Willet £5, to be paid by my executrix within three years after my decease.

I give my grandchild John Willett £5, to be paid by my executrix within four years after my decease.

I give Edward Willett the standing bed now in the hall with [the] appurtenances, after the decease of my executrix.

I give after the decease of my executrix, to my grandchild, Jon Willett, one board and frame and three joint stools now in the hall.

I give after the decease of my executrix, one cupboard now being the Hase[?] unto my grandchild William Willett.

I give all my lands, houses, orchards and gardens in the parish of Lanblethian unto my daughter Bridgett Willett during her life and in case that my heir-at-law do molest or trouble her, then I devise the foresaid lands and houses unto my grandchild Edward Willett and his heirs for ever.

My will is that he[the person] who shall enjoy the foresaid lands, houses, orchards and gardens, after the decease of my daughter Bridgett Willett, shall pay £8 unto my daughter Ann Willett if she do so long live, otherwise to her heirs, the sum to be paid within six months after the decease of my dearest daughter Bridgett Willett.

I give my grandchild Edward Willett £8, to be paid by him[the person] that enjoys the foresaid lands and houses after the decease of Bridgett Willett, within one year of her decease.

I give my grandchild Jon Willett £8, to be paid by him[the person] that shall enjoy the said lands, houses and gardens after the decease of my daughter Bridgett Willett, within eighteen months after my daughter Bridgett Willett's decease.

I give my grandchild William Walter £5, to be paid by him[the person] that enjoys the foresaid lands, houses and gardens after my daughter Bridgett Willett's decease, to be paid within three years after my executrix's decease.

I give my grandchild William Walter one great brass cauldron to be delivered presently after my decease.

Will of Jenkin Willett of Llanblethian Cont'd

In case my heir-at-law, or Edward Willett does not pay the foresaid legacies then I devise the said lands, houses, gardens and orchards unto my son Jenkin Willett and his heirs for ever.

I appoint my daughter Bridgett Willett sole executrix of this my last will and testament.
