Will of David William, 13th September, 1699, proved, 14th April, 1702

In the Name of God Amen I David William of the parrish of Lanblethian in the County of Glam[or]gan and diocesse of Landaph weaver. being of p[er]fect memory. all praise be given unto Almighty god. doe make the present writing to be my last will & testament.

first I Commend my soule unto Almighty god my Creator. believing that through his mercy & the merits of Jesus ch[ris]t my Redeemer to be saved. any my body to ch[ris]tian Buriall in my p[ar]ish church of Lanblethian aforesaid.

Item I devise and bequeath unto my son Edward david. one Cottage with its appurten[an]c[e]s. being my dwelling house together with one Croft lying opposite to the said dwelling house. being in Lanblethian afores[ai]d to be freehold unto my said son Edward david. & to his heirs and ass[ign]s for ever/

also I devise and bequeath unto my son William david one Cottage with its appurten[an]c[e]s where he now dwelleth. being in Lanblethian aforesaid to be freehold unto him the s[ai]d William david & to his heirs & ass[ign]s for ever

also I charge my Executror hereafter named with the payment of ffive pound owing upon my s[ai]d son William david / unto Richard Bassett of Lanblethian afores[ai]d Barb ,

also I bequeath unto my daughter Barbara David. fifty shillings in Remembrance of me /

also I bequeath unto her daughters & my Grandchildren Margarett and Mary Hopkins twenty shillings apece in Remembrance of me /

also I bequeath unto my Grandchild David W[illia]m. the son of my said son William David twenty shillings in Remembrance of me.

The Rest and Residue of all my goods cattle & chattels herein not before bequeathed. I give and bequeath unto my said Son Edward david whome I do no[m]i[n]ate and appoint sole Executor of this my last will and testament And hereby Revoaking all form[er] or other will or wills & this only I allow to be my last will & testam[en]t witnes my hand & seal the thirteenth day of September: in the eleventh year of the reign of King William the third of England etc. Ano d[omi]ni 1699

11. Will of David William, weaver

In the name of God amen, I David William of the parish of Lanblethian, weaver, make my last will and testament. I commend my soul unto almighty God, my creator, believing that through his mercy and the merits of Jesus Christ my redeemer to be saved and my body to christian burial in my parish church of Lanblethyan.

I give my son Edward David one cottage with its appurtenances being my dwelling house together with one croft lying opposite being in Lanblethian to be freehold unto my son Edward David and his heirs for ever.

I bequeath unto my son William David one cottage with its appurtenances where he now dwelleth being in Lanblethian to be freehold unto him and his heirs for ever.

I charge my executor with the payment of £5 ... upon my son William David, unto Richard Bassett of Lanblethian, barbor.

I bequeath unto my daughter Barbara David 50s in remembrance of me. I bequeath unto her daughters, my grandchildren, Margaret and Mary Hopkins, 20s apiece in remembrance of me.

I bequeath unto my grandchild David William, the son of my son William David, 20s in remembrance of me.

The rest of my goods I give unto my son Edward David whom I appoint sole executor of this my last will and testament and hereby revoking all former wills. Witness my hand and seal 13 September 1699.
