

The will of Richard Bassett, senior, of Llanblethian, yeoman, dated 20th., November 1717.

Having surrendered  $9\frac{1}{2}$  acres of customary lands called Caia Hwnt at the Court Barron held 15th., May 1707, he grants the land to Thomas Wilkins of Llanblethian, gent, according to the custom of the manor, in trust to raise £50 within a year of death to be used as follows.

£10 towards funeral expenses.

To his nephew John Sherie? £10.

To his nephew Robert Sweeting £5 10s.

To his niece Elizabeth Sherie? £3.

To his nephew Richard Jenkin £3.

To his niece Maud Sweeting £3.

To his nephew William Sweeting 10s.

To his nephew Morgan William, 5s

To Richard Morgan, Morgan William's brother, 5s.

To William Morgan, the younger brother, 5s.

To his old maid servant Jane Howell, £7 10s. Also the feather bed and appurtenances, a brass pan, tongs and shovel.

To his nephew, Robert Sweeting, his best suit of wearing apparel.

His customary heir and nephew, Charles Bassett to be executor.

 in the County of Glamorgan yeoman Having the uncertainty of this life Do in  
 health and sound memory make this my last will and Testament bequeathing  
 my soul to God and my body to the grave And as for my bodily Substances  
 I devise give and bequeath the same as followeth - In presence whereof I have  
 at a Court Baron hold for the Mannor of Lambloithan the 15<sup>th</sup> day of May 1707  
 surrendered all those Nine Acres and a half of Customary lands called Gora  
 nunt lying in Lambloithan aforesaid To such use I should by my will and  
 Gods limit and appoint Therefore I do hereby give grant and devise the  
 said premises with their appurtenances To Thomas Wilkins of Lambloithan  
 good to hold to him and his heirs according to the Customs of the said Mannor  
 In trust and to the severall uses following That is to say to the Intent that  
 he or his heirs shall out of the Rents Issues and profite of the said premises or by  
 sale thereof or any parte thereof Raise and pay the summe of fifty pounds  
 within one year after my decease to the purposes and persons following vizt  
 towards my funeral Expenses the summe of ten pounds, To my Nephew John  
 Sherra the summe of ten pounds, to my Nephew Robert Sweeting five pounds  
 ten shillings, to my Niece Elizabeth Sherra three pounds, To my Nephew Richard  
 Jonkin three pounds To my Niece Maud Sweeting three pounds, To my Nephew  
 William Sweeting ten shillings, To my Nephews Morgan William five  
 shillings Richard Morgan his brother five <sup>shillings</sup> and William Morgan the younger  
 brother five shillings, To my old maid servant Jane Howell seven pounds &  
 ten shillings, Item I bequeath to my said Maid servant Jane the <sup>with one year</sup> ~~last~~ <sup>of her</sup> ~~last~~ <sup>of her</sup> ~~last~~ <sup>of her</sup>  
 with its appurtenances which I shall last see on and up in my life time, Item  
 I bequeath ~~all my wearing apparel~~ <sup>all my wearing apparel</sup> to my said Nephew Robert Sweeting my  
 best suit of wearing apparel - And lastly I Nominate and appoint my Nephew  
 and Customeyer his Charles Bassett my Executor of this my last will In Witness  
 whereof I have this twentieth day of November in the fourth year of the Reign of King  
 George put my hand and seals Annoq Domini 1717
