

The will of Lewis Grant of Llanblethian, yeoman, dated 3rd., October 1725.

To his cousin, Robert Grant of Llysworney, his best pair of shoes, stockings and hat.

To his nephew Lewis Grant, the son of Robert Grant, the best horse.

To his step daughter Alice, a young cow and one other.

To his niece Jenett, the wife of James Howell, a shilling.

To his niece Joan Grant the wife of Thomas George, one shilling.

To his wife Maud Thomas three quarters of an acre of customary land in the manor of Llanblethian commonly called ~~Filihaya?~~ ^{+ 4 flh covers} and after her death to Lewis Grant. Killhays

To his wife the freehold house and appurtenances in Llanblethian and after her death to Lewis Grant

(Maud Thomas) to William Deere of St. Mary Church.)

Rest of his property to his wife as executrix.

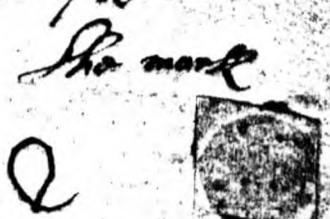
