To his wife Anne the interest of all such money that he may possess at his death and the principle to be divided equally on her death between their daughters Elizabeth, Margaret and Anne.

All the rest of his goods to his wife as executrix.

I give & bequeath unto my loving wife Anne the
Interest of all such money that I shall ever receive
of or intitled unto at the time of my Decease for
the course her natural Life only & the principle to
be divided after her decease to & amongst my daughters
Elizabeth, Margaret & Anne equally share & share
alike, Item I give & bequeath unto my wife
Anne all the rest & residue of my personal Estate
& I doe hereby appoint her to be my sole Executrix
and residuary Legatee In Witness whereof I
have hereunto set my Hand & Seals this twentieth
day of September in the year of our Lord one
Thousand Seven Hundred & Thirty two
