To Ethlow Francis Nicholas, his servant maid, the freehold land in Penllyn and all his goods.

To his brother Miles Bassett 1s.

To his brother ? Bassett's children 1s each.

To his sister Rachel Bassett, 1s.

Ethlow Francis Nicholas to be executrix.

Signed by Thomas Bassett.

Witnessed by William Sweeting, William Rosser, Thomas Bassett.

 chattels after my decease unto the said Ethlow Francis Nicholas Item
 I give and bequeath unto my brother Miles Bassett one shilling to be
 paid him by my executor Item I give and bequeath each of them one
 shilling unto my daughter Mary Bassett's children to be paid them as aforesaid
 Item I give and bequeath unto my sister Rebecca Bassett one
 shilling to be paid her by my executor and I do hereby nominate and
 appoint the aforesaid Ethlow Francis Nicholas to be my sole executor
 and first I do revoke renounce frustrate and make void every will
 or will by me made formerly and I do declare and appoint this to be
 my last will and testament wherof I have hereunto put my hand and
 seal the day month and year first above writon
