

The will of William Morgan of Newton, Llanblethian yeoman, dated 26th., March 1755.

To his daughter Mary Abraham 1s.

To his granddaughter Jane Abraham, daughter of Mary Abraham, 5s.

To his daughter Margaret Morgan, who was living with him all the rest of the goods as executrix.

The mark of William Morgan.

Witnessed by Jenkin Morris, William Thomas.

Proved 30th., September 1755, the assets amounting to less than £20.

In the Name of God Amen, I William Morgan
of Boston in the parish of Laublithan and County of Glamorgan
woman being weak in body but in Perfect Memory that is to say
I give to my Daughter ^{Mary} Abraham one Shilling, and I also
give to my Granddaughter Jane Abraham Daughter of yours
Mary Abraham five Shillings, Item, I Give and bequeath
to my Daughter Mary Morgan now living the ~~whole~~
my Personal Estate what kind so ever and appoint her
Heir and sole Executor and Refusee of this my
Last will and Testament, in Witness whereof I put my
hand and seal the Day and Date here of the 26 Day
of March 1755:

same, to exhibit an Inventory &c. and to render a true Account of
her Administration thereof, when thereunto lawfully required.
