

The will of William Thomas, Esquire, of Llanblethian, dated 9th November 1780.

To his sister, Mary John, widow and to his niece Margaret Thomas, spinster, all his lands in Llanblethian, Llantrisant and St. Brides Minor.

To Mary John and Margaret Thomas all lands held under leases from Charles Edwin in Llanblethian and Llanmihangel for the term of those leases.

To Mary John and Margaret Thomas, all plate, china, household furniture and stock of the land to be divided equally between them.

The rest of his goods to Mary John and Margaret Thomas as joint executrixes of the estate.

In the Name of God, amen. I William Thomas, of
Lanblethian in the County of Glamorgan Esquire being weak
in Body but of sound mind memory and understanding
Praise be to God Do make and ordain this my last Will
and Testament in manner following (that is to say) I
give and Devise unto my Sister Mary John widow and
my Niece Margaret Thomas Spinster all and every my
meffuages Lands Tenements Hereditaments and premises
with the appurtenances whereof I am seized in fee Situate
lyng and being in the several parishes of Lanblethian
Lanbysant and Saint Bridis minor in the said County of
Glamorgan To Have and To Hold the same unto my said
Sister Mary John and my said Niece Margaret Thomas
and the Survivor of them and the Heirs of such Survivor for
ever. I also give and Bequeath unto my said Sister Mary
John and my said Niece Margaret Thomas all those
Lands and premises which I now hold by virtue of two
several Indentures of Leases under Charles Edmon Esq:
Situate lyng and being in the several parishes of
Lanblethian and Lanmihangle in the said County of
Glamorgan To Hold the same unto my said Sister Mary
John and my said Niece Margaret Thomas and the Survivor
of them and the Executors and Administrators of such Survivor
for and during the Residue and Remainder which will be there
to come of the Term in and by the said several Leases granted
under the Ment's Reservations and Covenants therein specified.
I also give and Bequeath unto my said Sister Mary John
and my said Niece Margaret Thomas all my plate, Chintz
ware and Household Furniture together with all my Stock
on the Land to be Equally Divided between them Share and
Share alike all the Rest and Residue of my Goods Chattels
and personal Estate I give and Bequeath unto my said Sister
Mary John and my said Niece Margaret Thomas whom
