The Condition of this Obligation is such That if the above bounden Catherine
Phillip the Relict and Administratrix of all and singular the Goods
Chattels and Credits of David Phillip late of Llanblethian deceased do
make or cause to be made a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the Goods
Chattels and Credits of the said deceased which have or shall come to the Hands
Possession or Knowledge of her the said Catherine Phillip
or into the Hands and Possession of any Person or Persons for
her and the same so made do exhibit or cause to be exhibited into the Registry
of the Consistory Court of Llandaff at or before the
last day of November next ensuing and the same Goods
Chattels and Credits and all other the Goods Chattels and Credits of the said deceased
at the time of his death which at any time after shall come to the hands or Possession
of the said Catherine Phillip or into the hands
and Possession of any other Person or Persons for her do well and truly administer

of her said Administration at or before the last day of May
