 give to the woore of St Maryhill one buyell of rostate
 against Christmas to be distributed by the discretors
 of my executors hereafter named Item I give to my

 Howell his four Children wch livinge five Shillings
 a pece, Item my Legacie funeralls debts and be
 charged in Lawe (if neede be) concerninge my debts
 discharged, I give and bequeath to my Brother in Lawe
 John Price Parson of St Athan and my Nephew
 John Howell of yf Trodowen whom I appointe and
 appointe executors of this my last Will all the rest
 of my goodes & attells, land & cattells not be given
 bequeathen to be employede accordinge to the discretion
 and good discretion for the Education and Maintenance
 of my poysele Children, David, Jane, and Margaret
 and to binde them apprentice to some honest trades
 whereby they maye learne their livinge in the feare
 of god finallye I doe devise and give John Dooly
 Esq and John Williams one of the Aldermen of London
 to be overseers of this my last Will and testament
