Know all Men by these presents that We Eleanor Arees of the parish of Llangan, in the County of Glamorgan Widow, Thomas David of the parish of Penlline, in the County of Glamorgan aforesaid Taylor, and David Thomas of the Parish of Llangan aforesaid, in the County of Glamorgan aforesaid, do hereby bind and the Right Reverend Father in God M^{ts} R^{ts} Episcopus permissus Lord Bishop of Landaff in the sum of four Hundred & pound of good and lawful Money of great Britain to be paid to the said Lord Bishop or his lawful attorney his Ex^{ts} Adm^{rs} Successors or assigns for the good and faithful payment of which sum we and truly to be made the said widows and each of us jointly and severally for the whole our Term Ex^{ts} Adm^{rs} for ever these presents sealed with our Seals and Dated the 23rd Day of September 1771. &c

The Condition of this obligation is such that if the above bounden Eleanor Arees widow the Relict and Administratrix of all and singular the Goods, Chattels and Credits of Thomas Arees late of the parish of Llangan, in the County of Glamorgan and Heir of Landaff deceased. do make or cause to be made a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the Goods, Chattels and Credits of the said deceased which have or shall come to the hands possession or knowledge of the said Eleanor Arees or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons for her and the same to make do admit or cause to be admitted into the Registry of the Consistory Court of Landaff at or before the last Day of December next ensuing and the same Goods Chattels and Credits and all other the Goods, Chattels and Credits of the said deceased which at the time of her Death or which at any time after shall come to the hands and possession of the said Eleanor Arees or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons for her do not and truly administer according to Law; and further do make or cause to be made, give and bear Accounts of her said Administration at or before the last Day of September which will be in the year 1772 - and all the rest and residue of the said Goods, Chattels and Credits which shall be found remaining upon her said Administration's Account the same, being first examined and allowed of by the Judge of the said Court for the time being shall deliver and pay unto such person or persons respectively as the said Judge by his Decree or Sentence pursuant to the true intent and Meaning of an Act of Parliament intituled an Act for the better settling of Intestates Estates shall think and appoint and if hereafter it shall appear that any Act will and Sentence was made by the said deceased and the Executor or Executors therein named do exhibit the same into the said Court shewing request to have it approved accordingly if the said Eleanor Arees being therunto lawfully required do render and deliver the said Letters of Administration Appraisal of said Intestates being first had and made into the said Court; She shall be obliged and of none Effect or else to remain in full Force and Virtue.
