saint Donats, in the County of Glamorgan Widow, David William  
of the said parish of welsh saint Donats, in the County of Glamorgan  
aforesaid Yeoman, and Aees Basset of the same parish Yeoman.

we become bound unto the right Reverend Father in God Edward our by Divine permission  
Bishop of Landaff, in the sum of three hundred or more pounds of gold and lawful Money of Great  
Britain, to be paid unto the said Lord Bishop or his lawful attorney, his Exors. Administrors or assigns, for the  
good and faithful payment of which sum well and truly to be made, we bind ourselves and each of us  
Jointly and Severally for the whole, our Heirs, Exors. & Admrs. firmly by these presents sealed with our  
Seals and Dated the 28<sup>th</sup> Day of March, in the Year of our Lord 1754.

The Condition of this Obligation is such, that if the above bounden Mary Lewis Widow,  
the Widow and Administratrix of all and singular the Goods, Chattels and Credits of John  
Lewis late of the parish of Welsh Saint Donats, in the County of Glamorgan and  
Diocese of Landaff deceased

do make or cause to be made, a true, perfect Inventory of all singular Goods, Chattels, Credits of the said Deced, which have  
or shall come to her hands, possession or knowledge of the said Mary Lewis  
or into hands or possession of any other person or persons for her and the same so made do exhibit or cause to  
be exhibited into the Registry of the Consistory Court of Landaff, at or before the Twentieth Eighth  
June next ensuing, and the same Goods, Chattels and Credits, and all other the Goods, Chattels and  
Credits of the said Deced, which at the time of his Death or which at any time after shall come  
to the hands or possession of the said Mary Lewis or into  
the hands or possession of any other person or persons for her do well and truly administer  
according to Law; and further do make, or cause to be made, a true and just Account of her  
said Administration, at or before the Twentieth Eighth Day of March  
which will be in the year 1755 and all the rest and residue of the said Goods, Chattels and  
Credits which shall be found remaining upon the said Administration Account the  
same, being first examined and allowed of by the Judge of the said Court for the time being,  
shall deliver and pay unto such person or persons respectively as the said Judge by his Decree or  
Sentence pursuant to the true Intent and Meaning of an Act of Parliament intituled an  
Act for the better settling of Intestates Estates shall direct and appoint; and if hereafter it  
shall appear any last Will and Testament was made by the said Deced, and the Exors. or Admrs.  
therein named do exhibit the same into the said Court, making request to have it  
approved of accordingly if the said Mary Lewis or being thereunto  
lawfully required, do render and deliver the said Account of Administration, Appraisal of such  
Settlement, being first had made into the said Court; then this Obligation to be void and of no Effect or  
else to remain in full force and Virtue.
