Others taking part were REVS. WILLIAM GRIFFITH (Gower), DAVID HOWELL (Swansea), and WILLIAM EVANS (Tonyrefail)

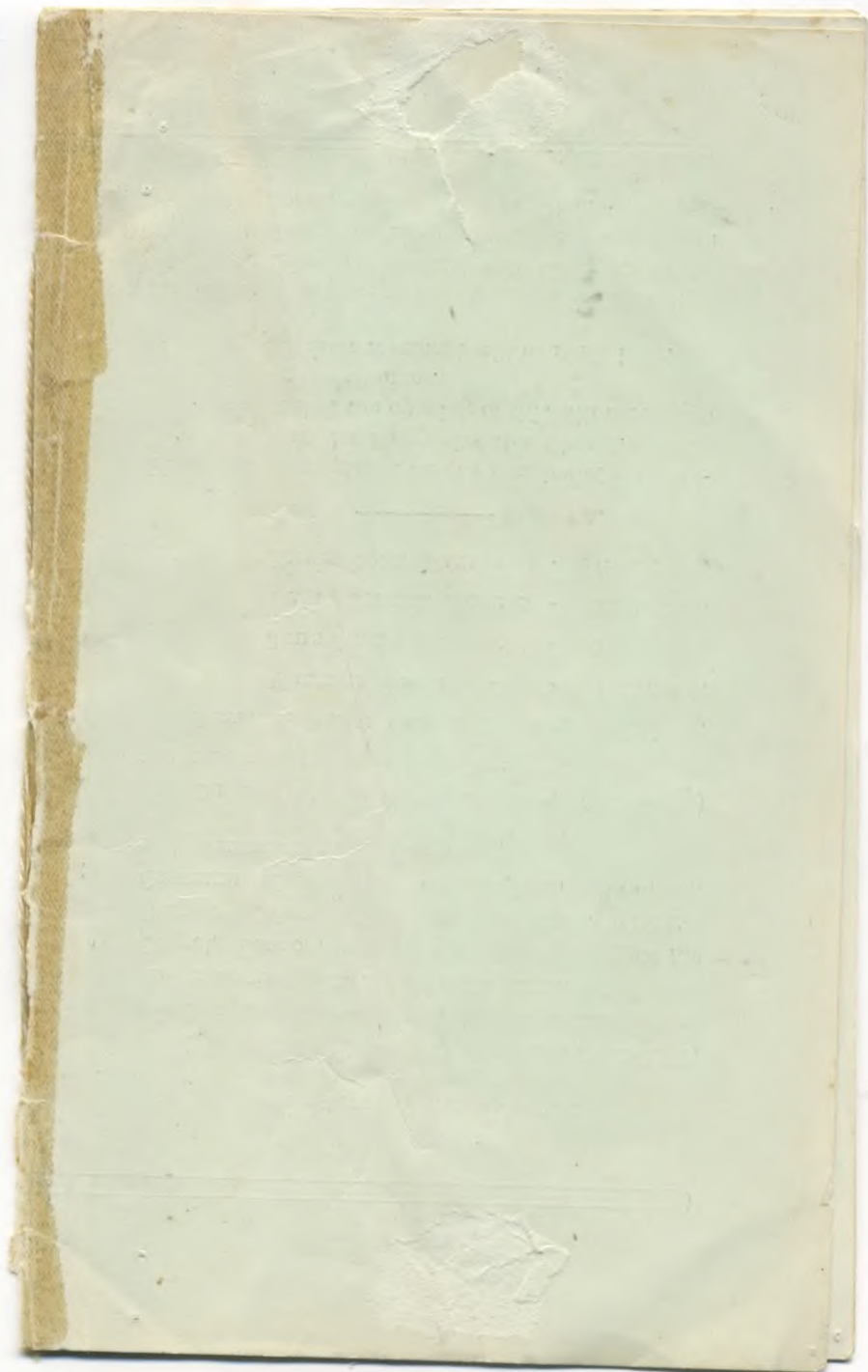
During the second half-century (1875-1925) the pastorate has been held by :

REVS. BENJAMIN DANIEL THOMAS,	1873-1879.
WILLIAM LEWIS	- - 1881-1885.
JOHN JAMES MORGAN	- 1892-1895.
DAVID THOMAS MORGAN	- 1901-1905.
EMRYS JOHN DAVIES	- from 1906.
