Miss Culverwell had kindly arranged the catering for the children, and in this she was well assisted by the teachers of the Sunday Schools. Mr Elias of the Ship Hotel provided the crockery, hot water etc.

We are naturally very grateful to Mr Williams, the station, for facilitating the journey to and from the Leys; and also to Alderman L Jenkins for his kindness in placing at our disposal one of his wagons with horse and driver for the cartage of the eatables from Cowbridge to the Leys, and the small children to and fro from the station to the sea.
