WAH Fisher (Book 27) refers to a William Lewis of Llanquian who died in 1855 aged 53. He left a place on his left at his grave for his illegitimate son 'begotten in body of his cousin who lived with him in his bachelor days at Trebettin'.

Five closes of arable meadow and pasture called Dwyr Trebettin (about 4 acres), Erw a hanner (about 2 acres), Erw y hanner (about 2 acres) in the parish of Llanblethian in the occupation of Jonathan Mazey as yearly tenant – owner James Maxse (possibly the steward is R Mumford of Trebettin and Maindy House)

1872, 28th October Mr John Thomas favoured with instructions from Mr Wm Tilley, who is giving up farming, to sell by auction stock, crops, implements – Trebettin Farm, nr Cowbridge

1881 -1889 William Tilley, owner, house and land at Trebettyn Register of electors

William Tilley was the father of Alderman David Tilley, who became mayor of Cowbridge. William, from Wiltshire, moved from Trebettyn into Cowbridge west end where his family grew up.

1912 Marriage of Margaret Anne Rees of Trebettin Llanblethian church records

1919, February Tilley family sell Trebettyn (M A Tilley dies 1925) *Document : chs05801*
