COWBRIDGE

WITH

LLANBLETHIAN.

COWBRIDGE is a borough and small market town in the parish and hundred of its own name, county of Glamorgan, 170 miles W. of London, 12 W. of Cardiff, and 7 E. of Bridgend. This ancient looking town which is almost comprised in one long continuous street, running from east to west; besides a church, an endowed grammar school, and several well-built houses, contains a town hall and convenient market place, and in its immediate neighbourhood three castles are to be found. Cowbridge, in conjunction with Cardiff and Llantrissaint, returns one member to Parliament. The borough of Cowbridge is governed by a mayor, who holds his office for life, and two bailiffs annually elected by the burgesses. A court of record may be holden under charter of Charles 11.; but the corporation does not avail itself of this privilege, the only court being one of common council, held as often as affairs connected with the borough may require.

Cowbridge, being destitute of manufactures, is thrown entirely upon its own resources, the principal of which is agriculture; the markets and fairs, however, contribute something in support of the borough; the former is held on Tuesday, and the latter occur as follows. First Tuesday in February, Tuesday before 25th of March, 4th of May, June 24th, first Tuesday in August, September 29th, and the first Tuesday in December, and are well supplied with cattle of every description.

The parish church is dedicated to St. Mary, and the living is a rectory in the gift of the Dean and Chapter of Gloucester.

Here are three places of worship for dissenters of various denominations. The only charity is a grammar school, founded by Sir Leoline Jenkins, secretary of state to James II. In 1831 the number of inhabitants was 1097, but in 1841 it had decreased to 1080.

COWBRIDGE.

LLANBLETHIAN is a parish in the hundred of Cowbridge, and is situated one mile, S.W. from the latter place. This village contains nothing to excite particular attention. In 1831 the population was 670, but in 1841 it had reached 724.
