And after due notice of the intention to make this Order published according to the direction of the Board by being affixed to the principal outer door of each of the abovementioned Chapels on the 30th November 1887, being more than one calendar month previously to the date hereof, and also sent through the Post to

EDWARD JOHN, late of Bridgend aforesaid, Currier; (being the only Trustee of the Charities who did not join in the said application) at his last known place of abode in Great Britain or Ireland, on the 29th November 1887:

And having received no notice of any objection to this Order or suggestion for the variation thereof:

## Do hereby Order as follows, viz.:-

- 1. The said EDWARD JOHN is removed from being a Trustee of the Charities:
  - 2. THOMAS REES, Solicitor;
    THOMAS JOHN PARSONS, Grocer;
    PHILIP GRIFFITHS, Grocer;
    WILLIAM JAMES DAVIES, Painter;
    GEORGE RICHARD PICKARD, Cabinetmaker;
    JOHN PICKARD, Grocer; and
    MATTHIAS DAVIES, Painter, all of Cowbridge;
    HUGH BEVAN, Merchant; and
    WILLIAM BUCKLEY, Ironmonger, both of Bridgend; and

WILLIAM ANDREWS, Postmaster, and WILLIAM LAWRENCE PRICE, Draper, both of

Llantwit Major, all in the County of Glamorgan; (who have respectively signified in writing to the Board their willingness to accept and act in the Trust) are appointed to be Trustees for the administration of the Charities, in addition to and jointly with

HENRY JOHNSON, and WILLIAM PRICE,

the continuing Trustees thereof:

3. The hereditaments described in the Schedule hereto, and all other lands and hereditaments (if any) held in trust for the Charities, and not being of copyhold tenure, shall forthwith vest in the said persons, who, by virtue hereof, are constituted the Trustees of the Charities, their heirs,

executors, administrators, and assigns, according to the legal nature of the same premises upon and for the subsisting trusts thereof.
