 my docto and legardey pale, and funerallis dysterday. All other my goods, plate, remell
 and custome wher so ever except my householde stuffe formerly bequeathed in manner as
 folleynge shalbe to say. One equall meytie or halfe pale thereof unto my said wif Elizabeth
 Wylde. And the other meytie or halfe pale thereof unto my daughter Elizabeth
 Wylde late pale and inheret her at the tyme of her mariage. And my mende shalbe to will to
 hatf of my said daughter, shalbe intermarie with any man without the approuement and consent of
 god mother onto my said daughter. That then her said portion shalbe come and remant unto
 my said executry, who shall dispose therof at her discretion. And my mende and will further
 is, that my said executry shalbe have and retayne in her owne handes and custome my said
 daughter said portion, and with the same, and interest therof shall mountayn & kepe
 her untill her said mariage. And I am, custome or usage of the Cittie of London to the con-
 straine therof, or of any thinge in this my present will contraynt notwithstanding. And if
 make, constutute, and ordene my said lanchour wif Elizabeth Wylde full and sole executry of
 this, my last will and testament, executors, all former, and other wifes legataries & bequeathers
 by me heretofore made mylled or bequeathed. And I constitute, and orname Mr. Richard
 Wylde of London merchant overisse of thid my last will and testament, writing and re-
 questing him to be ayding and assistance unto my said executry, and to set thid my will ex-
 ecuting accordyng to my true meaninge herin, therfor his paine I do give and entreate
 him to accept of my sole tyme of entente wher I nowe more lymet my selfe with a shipp
 and to meate the same in esemblye of me. In witness whereof I the said Henry
 L. unto thid my present last will and testament subscribed in one sheete of paper, have
 set my hand and seale the day and yere first abovewritten. By me Henry L. Sealed

daughter Margarett Whate twentye þonneid in money to be paid into her in thid paroch
manner byt ſumme þonneid therof within one yeare after my deceas and the other
ſumme þonneid therof within two yeare after my deceas And what I doo give and graue
unto the ſaid Margarett Whate one feather bed and boulter Item I doo give and graue
unto my youngeſt chylde Dorothy Stiff All that and theſe my two testaments
or rothagges together with all my lande therunto belonginge Situate heng or beynge
in the parochie of Engleſſe and ſubplantyd in the ſaid countie of Bedforde whiche
is formerly bought off Thomas Carty And all theſe houses eſcapes and buildings
which are nowe certayn and built upon the ſaid lande And also the Reuerayre ſeckton
therof and of every part and parell therof together with all my goods eſcapes and
oritementes þereto the ſame to have and to hold unto the ſaid Dorothy Stiff her
heire and assignees for ever Item all the rest and residue of my goodes and chattell whiche are
þenþerwithal my obit levaries and funeral expence ſet þis day and remeade byt
Item and ento my ſaid daughter Dorothy Stiff whom I doo ordene and make full
and ſole executry of this my last will and testament And I request my leue friends
Thomas Pemell and Thomas Warre of the ſtatute of the Countrey of Engleſſe ſetting my last will
and testament and to deale me a ſafe place in which ſhyll may and for their paynes I
gave them to þe þe pone a þecre In witness of the þeƿilled I the ſaid William
Stiff have hereunto set my hand and ſeal the day in a yere first above written
