

The Llanblethian Parish Society

The above-named Society was founded at a meeting held on 2th November, 1962, at which some 25 people were present.

The meeting recognised that the considerable development of the Parish during recent years would continue, and that a continuing growth in the population of the Parish is certain.

The objects of the Society are to preserve the appearance and character of the village of Llanblethian as much as possible during its development, and to encourage the improvement of existing amenities by such means as the planting of trees and the concealment of eyesores.

At the same time, it is considered desirable to encourage greater community spirit by arranging social events.

The Society is seeking affiliation with the Council for the Protection of Rural Wales and the Civic Trust. And at the same time it will co-operate with the Rural District and Parish Councils.

The meeting elected Mr. Raymond Cory as Chairman, and Mr. G. A. Lloyd-Jones as Secretary. An Executive Committee composed of the Rev. E. O. T. Lewis, Mr. Harry Thomas, Mr. Gorb, Mr. Pagnamanta, Mr. Havers, Mr. D. D. Muir, Mr. G. Hunter and Mr. W. Stone was also elected.

The work of the Society will be assisted by three sub-committees, to which have been delegated the duties of 1. Liaison, 2. Activities, and 3. Social and Publicity work.

It is hoped to issue a quarterly leaflet to members detailing the Society's efforts and reporting on matters of interest to the village.

Membership is open to all residents in the Parish and also to non-residents, wherever they may now be, at a minimum annual subscription of 2/6d., or 5/- for family membership.
