Uniforms allow us to quickly identify members of the Emergency Services. They can signal expertise and rank, provide reassurance to the public, offer protection to the wearer and help foster team spirit.

## 21st March 1891

Winter Uniform 1st October to 31st May: Tunics, Caps, Belts, Leggings, great coats or Capes according to the weather. In Towns when great coats are in wear, leggings are to be worn. Dark wool gloves are to be worn. White collars are not to be worn.

Summer Uniform 1st June to 30th September: Serge and caps, Capes, great coats or leggings according to the weather. A clean white collar to be worn showing one quarter inch all round above blue collar.

Riots or Disturbances: Tunics, helmets (old if possible), no belts unless cutlasses are worn. Leggings, great coats or capes according to weather or orders.

Uniform was equally important to the Fire Brigade and the St John Ambulance Association. During the Second World War, the Air Raid Precaution wardens and volunteers in Civil Defence had their own specific clothing and protective headgear.
